Last month I had the opportunity to attend a convocation for Associational Directors of Missions at Ridgecrest Conference Center in North Carolina. This was the first time since 1989 that Associational Missionaries/Directors of Missions from across the country had come together for an event like this. It was great to see friends from New York, New Mexico, Texas, South Carolina, North Carolina, Tennessee & Georgia and to meet others from many different states. We had some great conferences, spent time discussing our roles as AMs/DOMs, spent time praying for one another and were challenged by some outstanding speakers. I left the event both encouraged and challenged for the days ahead in ministry and look forward to serving together with you.

It's hard to believe that October is here and that means our Annual Meeting. As you are aware we tried something new last year on Tuesday night and we had over 400 who attended our missions celebration. This year we will again have our business session on Monday night, which begins with a wonderful meal prepared by our churches, where we will adopt our budget and approve our reports. We will also hear from two speakers—Rev. David Reid, pastor Peachtree Community, and Rev. Allen

Hill, Specialist in Cooperative Program and Stewardship Ministries of the GBC, who will challenge us from God's Word.

On Tuesday night we will begin with a meal (cost—\$6.00) catered by Tabernacle, and missions fair where you will have a chance to see and hear about the many mission trips taken by our churches this past year. Then at 7:00 p.m. we will have our missions celebration led by the Tabernacle choir. We will hear testimonies from some missionaries and our special guest speaker that night is Dr. Gordon Fort, Vice President of the IMB. Both nights will be wonderful opportunities for you to see and hear what God is doing locally and around the world so make plans to come join us.

On Saturday, October 24th, FBC Villa Rica is hosting a GBC School of Evangelism. Dr. Steve Parr and the Evangelism Ministry Team of the GBC have put together an outstanding lineup of conference leaders for the breakout sessions on Saturday morning. Dr. Larry Wynn, pastor of Hebron, will be the keynote speaker at the worship service. I would encourage every pastor, staff member, lay leader, deacon, Sunday School

teacher, and evangelism leader to attend this Saturday morning conference. You will be out by 12:30pm so you only have to give up your Saturday morning not the whole day. Cost is \$10.00. Hope you will make plans to attend.

I am writing this article on Tuesday morning following the rain and flooding in our area. Our office has already received some calls for assistance. There are going to be many ministry opportunities in the days ahead and I know you stand ready to assist in meeting many of these needs.
