From Your Associational Missionary

“In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made...And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us. (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.” John 1:1-3, 14 (KJV)

Forty two years ago (1978) I celebrated my first Christmas outside the U.S. serving as a Journeyman missionary in Liberia, West Africa. There were no shopping malls, no “Black” Fridays, no Christmas open houses, no lights or decorations in the little town’s dirt streets, no parades, no Christmas trees being sold, no Christmas music being played in the stores and no wreaths on the doors of the homes. In fact, I only remember one Christmas tree and that was in the home of missionaries—Oren and Martha Robison.

I know that George, an American doctor who worked for the CDC and the Peace Corps workers, had some lights up but I don’t recall another tree in the whole town. The Swedish Pentecostal missionaries had candles and even came to sing for us one night before Christmas. Also the local Baptist Church had some candles in the windows. For me it was definitely an unusual Christmas. There were a few presents under the tree and I remember going to the Robison’s home on Christmas morning, making donuts (their tradition) and following breakfast, hearing the Christmas story, then opening the presents. It was a wonderful morning just celebrating the birth of our Savior and Lord and reflecting upon the “Word becoming flesh and dwelling among us.” I was not able to talk with my family on that day and I must admit I was a little homesick that afternoon not being with my family on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. I missed the cold weather and snow—it was 75 degrees there, but I was grateful that God had placed me right where He wanted me on Christmas Day—

even if it was quite different. But as I reflected on that, the passage from John 1 came to mind. I was reminded that Jesus had left his familiar surrounding and its beauty to be born in a stable surrounded not by royalty but poverty. His first Christmas away from home was quite different! From a majestic place to a manger surrounded by his earthly parents, animals, and later shepherds. His Father had placed Him right where He wanted Him to be on that first Christmas morning.

So this Christmas, my prayer for you is to spend some time looking at the manger and the Christ child who left His home for you. Remember to pray for our missionaries as they celebrate Christmas away from home. And remember “Because of Who He Is” we pray and give so these missionaries can stay and share.

### From the WMU

The Global Impact Guide that the IMB has published reports the success of our International Missionaries. It also shares future opportunities ahead for IMB missionaries. The guide provides some numbers that I hope would encourage us to give more to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering (LMCO).

- 154,937 people are dying daily without Christ
- 7070 unreached people groups (1.5 billion unreached people)

Our financial giving allows the IMB to get well trained missionaries into the field faster with established launch programs. The LMCO allows our missionaries to stay engaged in ministry instead of coming home to raise funds. The resources and reputation of the IMB allow us to get into remote areas to reach the

unreached with the hope of the gospel. They're also able to provide support and mental health care for our missionaries on the frontlines.

The LMCO supports 3,585 missionaries.


In 2019...


