Fourteen years. That seems like a long time. If a child began in PreK 14 years ago they would be graduating from high school this year. If a baby was born 14 years ago, that baby would be a middle schooler. If an individual was 50 fourteen years ago, he/she would be looking very closely at retirement now.

1999. That was fourteen years ago. The Y2k Bug was the topic of conversation but nothing happened. The world didn't end. The euro was established. Unemployment was at 4.2%. The cost of a first class stamp was 33 cents. Denver defeated Atlanta to win the Super Bowl and the NY Yankees beat the Atlanta Braves to win the World Series. Hundreds of VBS workers and Sunday School leaders have been trained during these fourteen years. Over 1500 boys and girls have enjoyed time at Rockridge during our Children's camp. What memories! But you know tomorrow will create another memory and I look forward to what tomorrow holds. Our association is a "Great Commission Resource Center," whose goal is to encourage, motivate, and strengthen every church to be a Great Commission church. We've come a long way but there is still much to do.

Thank you for partnering with us in local, state, national, and international missions. It's a joy to serve as your associational missionary. Thank you for 14 years! Dan
