Our family lost a good “friend” recently. We had known her for almost 15 years. In fact she was one of the first to greet us when we moved into our new home. No, she didn’t bring any cookies to welcome us with—she just came by, greeted us and decided to stay. Our good “friend” was our cat “Mittens.” She was a stray who just happened to wander into our neighborhood. We decided she needed a good home so she became a part of our family. We were lucky to have her all these years but we knew one day she would probably use up all of her “nine lives.” As you can imagine we have a lot of wonderful memories of Mittens. During the winter she stayed in the garage and every morning I would hear her scratching at the door wanting to come in and sit on one of our heat vents. During the summer she stayed outside and would scratch at one of the windows to let us know she was ready to come in and have her breakfast in the garage. Whenever we returned from school or the office “Mittens” would jump up on one of our cars

and lay on the hood because it was nice and warm. Many mornings I noticed paw prints on my windshield because she had slept on the top of my car. She also loved to sit in our family room at night and lay down on a newspaper or on my feet. I must admit its just not the same coming home and not seeing her hustling down the sidewalk to greet us or coming out of the garage stretching her legs. We are grateful for some special memories of her.

Memories. Wonder what memories the disciples had that evening after Jesus had died? They had been with him 3 and a half years and had watched him perform miracles and had heard him teach about many different things. They had watched his life and thought he was the Messiah, the Christ. But now He was gone—buried in a tomb with a stone rolled over it to make it secure. Perhaps they recalled how Jesus healed the blind man, the paralytic, the widow’s son, and called Lazarus from the grave. Or even memories of Jesus feeding the five thousand and calming the sea. Friday night and

Saturday must have been difficult days for them as they thought about what might have been. But as one writer said, “its’ Friday but Sunday’s coming.” And on Sunday everything changed. The grave was empty and Jesus was alive. And Jesus had so much more to teach them. Because He lived, all fear was gone. Death had been defeated. Sin had been conquered. Sadness had been turned into joy.

As we celebrate Easter remember the song by Bill and Gloria Gather entitled “Because He Lives” - “Because He lives I can face tomorrow, Because He lives all fear is gone. Because I know He holds the future, And life is worth the living just because He lives.”

I’m grateful that during the Easter season I can remember His death and all he endured for me—the beatings, the pain, the agony. Yet I rejoice that the story didn’t end on Friday. It was Friday but Sunday was coming. And Sunday was a new day—He was alive.


